FROM THE PRESIDENT

THE ABSOLUTE NECESSITY FOR ALL "WATER PEOPLE" TO REMAIN INFORMED AND UNITED!

Boating Western Australia (BWA) meets regularly with Govt Departments, Authorities and Island Management to ensure safe access, good facilities and opportunity to have a say in the direction of our Marine and Tourism Environment.

BoatingWA are the ONLY Boating Group/Assoc that regularly and actively looks after the Boater – YOU!!!

ARE YOU A MEMBER - IS YOUR OPINION BEING REPRESENTED - JOIN THE BWA TEAM!

State and Federal Projects currently underway absolutely have potential to override or impede the ability of West Australians to partake of the greatest enjoyment and leisure asset Western Australia possesses! Our Rivers and beaches - and all the pastimes, and endeavours that they support.

RIVER

The Swan River supports, Yachting, Power Boating, Swimming, Fishing, Jet Skis, Tourism, Boat Moorings/ Pens, Yacht Clubs. All of these pastimes could be dangerous to each other – were it not for "Shared Water Usage Reviews", regularly undertaken by DTMI (Dept of Transport) to ensure that we use our designated areas and we do that at specific times. All sharing, and NO clashes. That becomes more difficult with the increasing population and new sports – all demanding time and space. The term 'Finite resources" springs to mind!

Now if you throw on top of that – An Electric High Speed Ferry – travelling through the existing areas and activities -SILENTLY AND AT HIGH SPEED – then you can easily visualise the potential for chaos! Boaters in these areas are constantly on the watch for kids in optimas (tiny yachts) intent on "Racing" – and oblivious to other boats and often their own safety.

Space to be occupied on some of the prime riverside (for Terminals) and the routes travelled by these ferries will absolutely have an impact on how and when we can use these areas of the river.

HARBOUR

Fremantle Harbour – Still has plans in place to relocate to Cockburn Sound – and then what becomes of the "Old Harbour".

Plans were put forward for a "Super Yacht" Harbour – and it may attract more tourism – it may also negate land based fishing and walks along the waterside.

ISLANDS

Rottnest Island – seems to many visitors that it approaches its "Saturation Point: . How many boats and how many tourists can it abide before its "Eco-health" is impacted. Astute Management on the Island is ensuring that all modifications and repairs take the facilities another step forward. (Everything keeps getting better!) That brings more Tourists and more vessels. This is our "Jewel on the Coast" and we certainly cannot afford to overwork/overload it. Moorings numbers are well managed – but they also have a limit and no more are envisaged.

COCKBURN SOUND

Overview of Cockburn Sound

Cockburn Sound. Boaters and Fishers have for many years (8 to 10) been denied the enjoyment of catching a few crabs (nothing better with Kids!) . It is only in the last 12 months that this has quietly and tentatively re-opened. Sea Grass/Posidonia depletion was identified as a major factor in the closure. Dredges and Barges operate 24 hours per day to remove sand/lime from the bottom of the Sound for the production of cement. Huge efforts have been made to "regenerate the grasses" — only this year have we seen a re-opening of Crabbing in the sound and on a considerably lesser quota/catch limit.

Bigger/Deeper channels will need to be dredged, along with moorings areas for large vessels, and there seems little doubt the seagrasses will suffer considerably. More rules will need to be inplace to ensure there is little/no interaction between large vessels and locals in boats. Amongst all of that will be Nuclear Subs coming down the Sound, and a wide security berth will be essential for them.

On the mainland will be a docking area for the servicing/repairs and this will have a security ring around it. The Stirling Navy base on Garden Island has also begun its necessary work, with lengthening the protective harbour groynes and will no doubt seek some deeper water.

Dredging will impact on the seagrass, inherent crustacea (prawns, crabs) will deplete if their grass is removed – and the Snapper stocks will be less inclined to come to the Sound if their prime food source is depleted. RecFishWest is working on exactly that question and how it might be overcome. Thank you RecFishWest Team!

FISHING

Demersal Fishing has now been banned from Kalbarri to Augusta – and will remain so for 18months.

That is a shattering outcome for local Boatees and Fishers! We were of the belief that the current limits, encouragement of Fishers to "put it back", and the high quality of catches out wide – that things were safe and well. Apparently.

The "Saving Grace" in this latest legislature is that when things return to normal – the West Coast Fishery (ie close to Perth on the coast will be entirely for Recreational Fishers. That will be a great boon to Boating and is something to look forward to.

REPRESENTATION

What we have along the WA Coast is being challenged for a "RAFT" of reasons – some good – and some not so good.

We need to closely monitor what is being put forward as every project undertaken will either inhibit what we have, or limit what can be done in the future.

Not everything that is proposed "will be good for us!" and BoatingWA works with Government, and Authorities to keep your Boating life as varied, enjoyable and safe as we can possibly make it. Some projects do need to happen and we are obliged to accept those. Some DO NOT! — and we will oppose those or strongly seek modification of the project to ensure that Boaters have full consideration.

We remain a strong voice to Government, and are involved in some of the "decision making" processes.

It has been approximately 1 year since BoatingWA was introduced to "Sailing On" through Mr Guy Mewburn (Co-Ordinatdor for WA)) and a lot has happened in that period. To bring everyone up to date: Sailing On – A New Program for Returned Service Men and Women.

Built on belonging, teamwork, and the power of the sea to strengthen and test those men and women.

For many returned men and women, the transition back into civilian life can be one of the most difficult journeys they will ever face . The structure, camaraderie and purpose that once shaped their daily lives can suddenly feel far away. Sailing On' was created to help bridge that gap — offering a space where former service personnel can rediscover teamwork, rebuild confidence, and reconnect with themselves and others. What make Sailing On stand out is its core belief that the ocean heals and sailing builds people up!

At its heart, sailing demands cooperation, trust, and clear communication – the same qualities that define effective military teams. On a yacht, everyone has a role. Every role matters. The success of the vessel relies on individuals working as a team.

To facilitate this:

Many Boaters who had a vessel no longer being used donated those vessels to Sailing On, some small and recently, some quite large.

The Team Members on Sailing On then set about the restoration, maintenance of these vessels to return them to racing/cruising condition.

Many then began competing and enjoying time on the Swan River, honing the skills of the Team Members, and the other benefit of this process is that it involves the Members with Club Members of Sailing Clubs. The vessels have generally belonged to these Members, and to see them out there competing once more is exciting and heartening. Their gift is once more on the water and delivering excitement and training for Ex Military Personnel.

With the donation of a larger vessel came the opportunity to compete on the Ocean. Bigger water, bigger races and bigger challengers.

"Avenue" was donated to the Sailing On Team and the restoration produced a competitive yachtd that could be ocean raced.

Boating Western Australia worked with several of the Coastal club, and also had discussion with the City of Cockburn find a berth from which Avenue could operate.

Fremantle Sailing club, through Commodore Kyle Timms, found a spot for a few months, whilst the Fremantle yachts were competing in the Bali Race and would be absent from the Club.

Commodore Timms and the Fremantle Sailing Club enabled the Sailing On Team to take their biggest step – Ocean Racing.

I am told that they managed to get out on water 4 or 5 times in that period, but there were other major gains, such a achieving the Safety Certificate for the vessel and total fit out for all the safety equipment – enormous jobs in themselves.

BoatingWA arranged the meetings and contacts that made this process happen, and we cannot thank enough Fremantle Sailing Club and Commodore Kyle Timms for their kind reception to Sailing On and its Members. The Sailing on Members were also able to spend time socialising with the Fremantle Sailing club Members and some camaraderie has grown between the two teams.

At this point, Sailing On and "Avenue" have gone back up river – but they have now experienced the thrill of the Ocean and there is little doubt that they will return to challenge and be challenge very soon. BoatingWa will keep working for opportunities for the Sailing On Team to house their Offshore Boat somewhere near the ocean, and seek interaction with Fremantle and other Clubs.

Which leads us to the next "Milestone" for the Sailing On Team. They have plans afoot to compete in the Sydney to Hobart Yacht Race and Sailing On Squads are undertaking similar plans and preparations in other states.

So – you can look forward to a Team of Returned Service People competing in the Sydney to Hobart Race - and rest assured that they will be competitive!

If you have any equipment that might assist in their efforts to restore and kit out these yachts – you can contact Stephen Knights (Board Member Boating Western Australia) and now patron of Sailing On.

Interesting also – Sailing On has "Not for Profit Status" and operates as a charity organisation. So, if you had a pen or mooring space around 10 to 12 metres that you wished to allow Sailing On to use – YOU WOULD BE ENTITLED TO A FULL TAXATION REBATE ON THAT RENTAL AMOUNT. Win/Win!

Boost for regional boating facilities

12 Dec 2025

Grants totalling more than \$2.4 million have been announced in round 30 of the Recreational Boating Facilities Scheme (RBFS).

In a win for regional boating every grant allocated in the latest round will go to projects in the regions, stretching from Wickham in the Pilbara to Peaceful Bay near Denmark.

The majority of the funding will be spent on major boat ramp and jetty upgrades at Wickham, Monkey Mia and South Yunderup while smaller projects to enhance facilities for users will be undertaken at Exmouth Boat Harbour and Peaceful Bay.

Funds were also allocated for planning of upgrades at Leeman boat ramp and at the Bundegi boat ramp.

Recreational fishing boost as FADs start going in the water

Fish aggregating devices (FADs) have been deployed along the WA coastline to provide more recreational fishing opportunities as the weather warms up.

Fish aggregating devices (FADs) have been deployed along the WA coastline to provide more recreational fishing opportunities as the weather warms up.

A total of 36 southern FADs will be deployed by mid-December between Steep Point near Shark Bay and Albany.

The Cook Government has invested \$459,000 through the Recreational Fishing Initiative Fund (RFIF) to continue the FADs program, which encourages fishers to switch their fish and target large pelagic species like tuna, wahoo, mahi mahi, and marlin.

FADs have been installed off the Mid West, with more devices set to go into metropolitan waters by the end of November and then along the south-west coast in early December.

A new interactive FADs webpage has also been launched, providing information on the FAD locations, the

closest boat ramp and the location of artificial reefs to help fishers plan their day out on the water.

The current network of FADs also includes eight new generation reinforced FADs which are permanently deployed off Broome and Dampier.

State-wide reforms to protect fish for future generations

The Western Australian Government has announced important reforms across WA's coastline to protect demersal fish like pink snapper, red emperor and dhufish from extinction and to help stocks recover for future generations.

- Important State-wide reforms will be introduced to protect severely depleted fish stocks from extinction
- West Coast Region to become an exclusive recreational fishing zone for snapper and dhufish following a 21-month recovery closure for boat-based recreational fishing
- West Coast region to be closed permanently to commercial fishing for demersal fish from 1 January 2026, with a compulsory buyback of commercial fishing licences
- Recreational and commercial fishing will remain open in all other regions under new management plans
- Cook Government investing \$29.2 million to support recovery efforts, including \$3.3 million for tackle shop rebates to encourage fishing for species not under threat

The Western Australian Government has announced important reforms across WA's coastline to protect demersal fish like pink snapper, red emperor and dhufish from extinction and to help stocks recover for future generations.

The latest scientific stock assessments for WA's prized demersal fish have shown several species including dhufish, which are only found in WA, are under severe threat.

After reviewing the science and undertaking extensive stakeholder consultation, including holding a Fishing Future Forum last month, the State Government today announced new targeted actions to be implemented along the WA coast.

Under the reforms, the West Coast fishing region from Kalbarri to Augusta will not reopen on 16 December 2025 and will become an exclusive recreational fishing zone, following a 21-month recovery closure for boat-based demersal recreational fishing.

During this recovery closure, a policy on spatial and further temporary closures to protect spawning fish will be finalised, before the fishery reopens in September 2027 for spring season. A species-level management approach that recognises the differing rates of recovery between demersals will also be considered during this time.

The West Coast Zone will be permanently closed to commercial fishing for demersals from 1 January 2026, with a compulsory buyback of commercial fishing licences.

Recreational fishing for demersals will remain open in all other regions with additional State-wide management measures introduced.

These include real-time reporting of demersal catches and revised catch and bag limits starting in later in 2026, allowing everyone to play their part in the recovery of these highly valued species.

Charter fishing in the Perth metropolitan area will be closed from 16 December 2025, however, charter fishing for demersals under the tag system will continue in the remainder of the West Coast Zone under a reduced annual catch limit of 25 tonnes.

To support the reforms, the State Government will invest \$29.2 million to help stocks recover to sustainable levels so there are fish for the future.

The Fisheries Support Package will support commercial and recreational fishers adapt to the incoming Statewide reforms needed to help rebuild severely depleted demersal fish stocks.

Mariners are advised that replacement and maintenance works on navigational aids within Ataturk Channel and Princess Royal Harbour.

Divers will be working in and around the work area, all dive vessels and divers in the water will be appropriately marked with the international code flag "A" in accordance with regulations.

All vessels taking part in these works will display lights and shapes in accordance with the Prevention of Collisions in State Waters Regulations 1983 at all times.

It truly was one of those days that remind us why we love this community — great people, great food, plenty of fun, and that unbeatable Rottnest magic.



Hello GIFAA Members,

The committee would like to take this opportunity to wish all members a Safe and Merry Christmas and an enjoyable New Year. Our membership base has been growing substantially, and we are at around 500 members. It's fantastic to see so much support for our association and we are truly thankful.

Stay safe on the water.

With the hot weather here, we expect to see more users at the island, particularly in Herring Bay. As such, we need to always maintain a safe environment for all users. Skippers of vessels are reminded to be always on the lookout for swimmers and paddle craft operators. People in the water are also reminded that large boats can often be harder to control at slow speeds and very susceptible to wind and tide influences. All members please be aware of other users, exercise patience and caution when using the bay and above all, stay safe!

Just a reminder that we are all operating in controlled naval waters and this comes with certain rules and regulations. The following are prohibited from naval waters (minimum 500 metres from the island):

- Dogs and pets are not permitted on the island or within in Naval waters. Penalties Apply.
- Spear fishing gear, nets and sandboards on shore or within Naval waters. Penalties Apply.
- Charter boats within Naval Waters.
- Drones are not permitted on the island or within naval waters.

Additional rules that apply:

- Access onto the island is between sunrise and sunset only
- There is a 5-knot speed limit in Herring and Pig Trough Bays
- Anchoring is not permitted within 50 m of any mooring or entrance channel
- Rafting of boats is not permitted
- Beach BBQ'S or open fires are not permitted on the Island
- Vessels greater than 13m are not permitted in Herring Bay

It is the responsibility of all members to follow the guidelines set out by the navy and to also ensure that other visitors to the island are made aware of the rules. If you witness any visitors not adhering, please say something to them in a polite manner. We have a very good relationship with the navy, and we should all work equally as hard to ensure that we are seen as contributing to governance of the island in a positive manner.

For any incidents on land, you also have the support of the Ranger, Linda Hocke who can be contacted during normal business hours on 0455 604 646. Outside of these hours you may also contact the Garden Island Security office on 9553 2273. For Emergencies, the contact number of HMAS Stirling is 9553 2222 and note that the Beach Emergency numbers (BEN) are BEN130 for Herring Bay and BEN132 for Pig Trough Bay

News from the Northwest

A 30-year-old Wickham man has been fined \$1994 in Karratha Court this week after being caught spearfishing in a sanctuary area and exceeding the bag limit for Barcheek Coral Trout.


Fisheries officers with the Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development had observed the man with a speargun in the waters of the Southern Montebellos Sanctuary Area in July.

Officers inspected his boat, carrying four licenced fishers, and located five Barcheek Coral Trout, exceeding the combined bag limit of four. The limit is one coral trout for each licenced fisher.

It is also an offence to be in possession of fishing gear in the Sanctuary Area – where all fishing is prohibited.

The offender had previously been issued with an infringement 12 months earlier for fishing in the same location.

Also in Karratha Court, a 51-year-old Canning Vale man was ordered to pay \$994 for obstructing Fisheries officers.



Fishers are required to comply with Fisheries officers directions, and it is an offence to obstruct an officer when performing a duty under the Fish Resources Management Act 1994.

At South Hedland Magistrates Court this week, a 50-year-old Queensland man was found guilty of using illegal fish traps at Finucane Island in June, taking a green mud crab and a western yellowfin bream.

Fisheries officers intercepted the man while retrieving his boat at the Finucane Island Boat Ramp. He did not hold a current recreational boat fishing licence.

Fish traps are prohibited across the State, because of their impacts on aquatic life indiscriminately catching crabs, fish, protected marine and freshwater species.

He was penalised more than \$1780 in total including \$450 for not having a fishing licence.

In a separate matter at the South Hedland Court last month, an 85-year-old man and 80-year-old woman from Ravenswood were ordered to pay almost \$7000 for exceeding the possession limit of finfish fillets.

An inspection by Fisheries officers in May at the Eighty Mile Beach Caravan Park, east of Port Hedland, found the offenders with a combined 38.66 kilograms of skinned fillets, exceeding the Statewide possession limit by 18.66 kilograms.

The possession limit for fillets is 10 kilograms of fillets from any species (no skin required once landed), plus 10 kilograms of fillets of large pelagic finfish, which must have skin attached for identification purposes.

DPIRD Regional Compliance North Director Stuart McDowall said with the holiday season approaching, anyone travelling to the region needed to be aware of the rules for each location and species before going fishing.

"Fishers must ensure they don't fish beyond the bag and possession limits and fish with legal gear, which is vital to the sustainability of our recreational fisheries," he said.

"The rules for recreational fishing are available in the Recreational fishing guide 2025 and information can also be found online by searching the rules by species and location."

Anyone who suspects illegal fishing activity should call FishWatch on 1800 815 507 or report the matter via the online form on Crimestoppers.

Completed Aquatic Use Reviews (AUR)

Bunbury Aquatic Use Review

The Department of Transport (DoT) has completed a review of aquatic use of the waters of Bunbury and the Casuarina Boat Harbour ensuing the ongoing safety, equitable use, and sustainability of this important waterway. The DoT would like to thank everyone for their interest and participation.

The review looked at current management arrangements in place and proposed improvements, including the future use of Koombana Bay for water-skiing, swimmer safety, speed limits and restricted access for vessels.

Changes are to take effect as of Friday 21 February 2025 including a reduction in the area for water-skiing at Koombana Bay, to accommodate the Casuarina Boat Harbour expansion, revised speed restricted areas and increased motorised vessel prohibited areas at Koombana Beach and the Casuarina Boat Harbour. Improved Navigational Aid infrastructure will also be implemented to provided for the safe access of all vessels utilising the Casuarina Boat Harbour redevelopment.

The changes follow extensive consultation with state and local government authorities and the general public through online surveys. These changes have been adopted in full after careful consideration of the feedback received, providing a majority of support for the proposals.
